

AQUATIC LIFE

Gauge

18 sts=4" on H8 crochet hook in single crochet

Abbreviations

BPsc (back post single crochet): insert hook into work, passing behind the vertical section, or post, of the stitch, continue as a sc.

ch (chain) = yarn over and pull the yarn through with hook to form a new loop.

sc (single crochet) = insert hook into stitch, yarn over, pull yarn through stitch with the hook, yarn over, pull yarn through both loops on hook.

sts = stitches

SIRENIA the SQUID

Materials

- 1 skein Louisa Harding Ondine (100% Cotton. 50g, 119 yds). Shown in Lichen- 6
- Size H8/5mm crochet hook
- Two buttons
- Needle
- Thread
- Stuffing

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PATTERN

Body and head

Round 1: sc 2, 5 sc in second ch from hook

Round 2: sc 2 in each sc (10 sts)

Round 3: *sc 1, 2 sc in next sc* 5 rep (15 sts)

Round 4: *sc 2, 2 sc in next sc* 5 rep (20 sts)

Round 5-9: sc 20

Round 10: *sc 1, 2 sc in next sc* 10 rep (30 sts)

Round 11: sc 30

Round 12: sc 2 in each sc (60 sts)

Round 13- 28: sc 60

Round 29: *sc 2, sc next two sc together* 15 rep (45 sts)

Round 30: *sc 1, sc next two sc together* 15 rep (30 sts)

Round 31-32: sc 30

Round 33: *sc 2 together* 15 rep (15 sts)

Round 34-35: sc 15

Round 36: *sc 2 in each sc* 15 rep (30 sts)

Round 37: sc 30

Round 38: *sc 1, 2 sc in next sc* 15 rep (45 sts)

Round 40-49 : sc 45

Round 40: *sc 1, sc next two sc together* 15 rep (30 sts)

Round 41-42: sc 30

Round 43: *sc 2 together* 15 rep (15 sts)

Sew on button eyes

Round 44: sc 15

Stuff spherical head only

Round 45: *sc 1, sc next 2 sc together* 5 rep (10 sts)

Round 46: *sc 2 together* 5 rep (5 sts)

Tie off and weave in ends

Upper Beak (refer to placement schematic)

Round 1: BPsc 10 in bottom of head on the side closest to the eyes in an arch, making a half circle around the center of the bottom of the head

Round 2: reverse, do not ch before beginning row, sc 9 (9 sts)

Round 3: reverse, do not ch before beginning row, sc 3, sc 2 together, sc 3 (7 sts)

Round 4: reverse, do not ch before beginning row, sc 1, sc 2 together, sc 2 together, sc 1 (4 sts)

Round 5: reverse, do not ch before beginning row, sc 2 together, sc 1 (2 sts)

Round 6: reverse, do not ch before beginning row, sc 1

Tie off and weave ends into head and upper beak.



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Lower Beak (refer to placement schematic)

Round 1: BPsc 9 in bottom of head on the side furthest from the eyes, almost completing the circle around the center of the bottom of the head

Round 2: reverse, do not ch before beginning row, sc 2, sc 2 together, sc 2 together, sc 2 (4 sts)

Round 3: reverse, do not ch before beginning row, sc 2 together, sc 1 (2 sts)

Round 4: reverse, do not ch before beginning row, sc 1

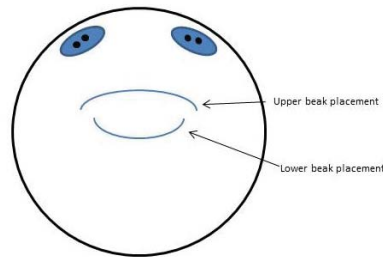
Tie off and weave ends into head and lower beak.

Arms

sc 38, tie off 8 rep

sc 76, tie off 2 rep

Tie arms onto head of squid in a circular formation around the beak. Weave ends into head.

JETTY the JELLYFISH

Materials

- 1 skein Rowan Handknit Cotton (100% Cotton. 50g, 93 yds). Shown in Sea Foam- 352
- Size H8/5mm crochet hook

Pattern

Body

Round 1: ch 2, 5 sc in second ch from hook
Round 2: sc 2 in each sc (ending up with 10 sts)
Round 3: sc 2 in each sc (ending up with 20 sts)
Round 4: *sc 1, 2 sc in next sc* 10 rep (ending up with 30 sts)
Round 5: *sc 1, 2 sch in next sc* 15 rep (ending up with 45 sts)
Round 6-11: sc 45
Round 12: BPsc 45 (Should be on outside of body)
Tie off and weave in ends

Inner Ridge

Round 1: BPsc 27 (On inside of the cup of jellyfish's body, 4th row from center)
Round 2: sc 27
Tie off, weave in ends.

Tentacles

Cut seven 17 inch lengths of yarn. Take one length of yarn and fold in half, making a loop at one end. Use crochet hook to pull this loop through the inner edge of the jellyfish, then pull the loose ends of the length of yarn through the loop and tighten. Repeat for each length of yarn, placing them evenly around the inner edge of the jellyfish. Fray the lengths of yarn.
